

The Cardiff Giant was discovered in 1869 by workers digging a well / railway tunnel in Cardiff, Wales / New York. Thousands of people paid to see this prehistoric / space-age monster which had been written about in Genesis 6:4. However, it was really a fake, made by a tobacconist / sculptor, George Hull, after an argument with a Methodist rabbi / Reverend who believed the Bible was literally factual. The film director / circus-owner P.T. Barnum wanted to buy the giant but Hull refused to sell, so Barnum made a replica which can still be seen today in Marvin's Marvellous Mechanical Museum in Detroit / Paris.




